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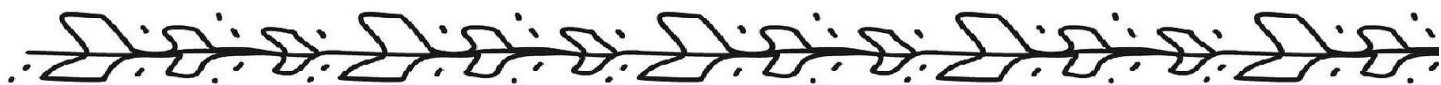

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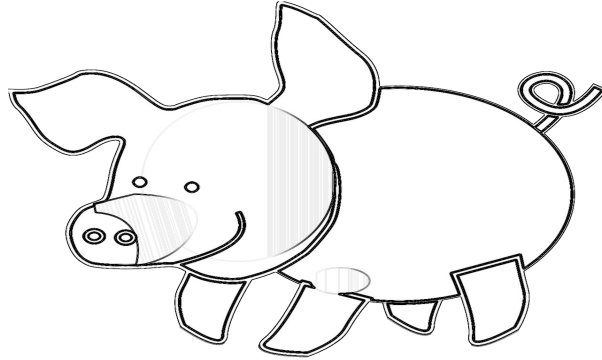

## Meet The Animal:: Pig



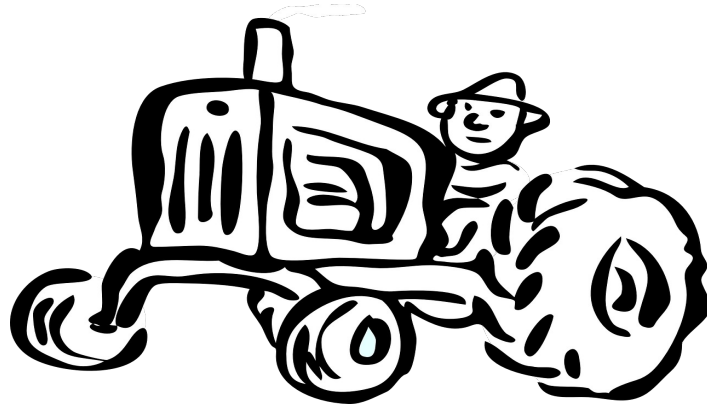
Male pigs are called boars, and females are called sows. Pigs are found and raised all around the world. They provide pork, lard, leather, glue, fertilizer, and a variety of medicines. Most pigs in the United States are classified as meat-type pigs.

Sows give birth to a litter called piglets. Piglets nurse for three to five weeks, and once weaned are called shoats. Piglets weigh 2.5 pounds at birth, and usually double their weight the first week. Fully grown pigs can weigh between 300-700 pounds, sometimes even more.

In the wild pigs eat anything from leaves, fruit, roots, rodents and small reptiles. They have poor eyesight, but a great sense of smell and use their snout to search for food. In the the United States pigs are fed a diet of corn. Pigs have sharp tusks that help them dig and fight. Farmers remove the tusk to protect other pigs, and people. Despite rolling in mud to keep cool, pigs are clean animals. They are also smarter than dogs.

# Community Worker: Farmer



A farmer is a person engaged in agriculture who raises animals for food or materials. A farmer also can do a combination of raising field crops, orchards, or vineyards. A farmer might own land, or might work as a laborer on land owned by others.
